Guiding Statement

Healing

What is Healing?

The belief that all humans are broken and damaged is a confession that we need healing. Jesus gives us this healing in his death and resurrection, then calls us to give that healing to others through the love and acceptance of Christian community.

Aspirational Target

All members of St. James willing to share with and able to help one another in a welcoming space provided by St. James.

<u>GOALS</u>

SPECIFIC – MEASURABLE – ACTIONABLE – RELEVANT

- By the end of first quarter, 2025, design a functional, accessible space that facilitates congregating of members for conversations, training, and social activities that is unanimously adopted by the congregation. To be functional, the design will include areas for private meetings, group meetings, and large social gatherings.
- By the end of first quarter, 2025, develop a list of at least 10 volunteers willing to provide Biblical advice on various topics (e.g., depression, post-partum depression, grief care, financial stress, divorce care) and train these volunteers.
- By the end of 2025, have an increase of 10% of members who have shared a personal struggle with another member.
- Include in the 2025 budget, with unanimous consent, \$2500.00 for a community fund designed to assist members who are facing a financial emergency or severe financial distress.

Community

What is Community?

The gospel is not a philosophical concept, but a new reality created by the death and resurrection of Jesus and lived-in presence and power of the Holy Spirit. This reality comes to full expression in the Christian community – where forgiveness, truth-telling, humility, and patience become the new creation way of life. Accepting people 100% - Forgiving

Aspirational Target

St. James will be the most welcoming and utilized community center of Glen Carbon, providing facilities and opportunities for worship, study, church and community programs and events, service projects, banquet facilities, and outreach programs.

GOALS

SPECIFIC – MEASURABLE – ACTIONABLE – RELEVANT

- St. James will participate in no less than four community service projects each year, beginning 2025, to serve Glen Carbon and the surrounding area with no less than 25 volunteers per event.
- By end of first quarter, 2025, St. James will greet every new visitor on Sunday mornings and reach out to all Glen Carbon residents (continuing monthly with new residents), and all members not currently attending worship, with a welcome kit of information about St. James and a personal invitation to visit or return to St. James.
- St. James will host various on-site community events (no less than one per quarter with an attendance of 40+ per event) starting January 1, 2025, to share the hope found in Jesus Christ and serve the Glen Carbon community.
- St. James will create an outdoor recreational/fellowship space on the current St. James property that will accommodate community events, children's playground and a sitting area for individual or small group discussions/prayers by June 2025.

Restoration

What is restoration?

Human history is headed toward a magnificent goal, the return of Jesus and the renewal of all creation. On the road to that goal Jesus calls his people to participate with him in this restorative mission, which is to do in Jesus' name and by his power the ministries he began before his ascension and continues to do now through his Holy Spirit. Meeting Physical and spiritual needs - Equipping ourselves to give biblical answers to the problems people have. Intentionally equipping ourselves to minister to the hurting people in Glen Carbon.

Aspirational Target

Every member of St. James will be actively involved in restoring people to Jesus by living as New Creation people now.

<u>GOALS</u>

SPECIFIC - MEASURABLE - ACTIONABLE - RELEVANT

- In early fall, 2024, St. James will host a ministry fair highlighting our current restorative ministry opportunities and seeking to create new ones-to which every member of the congregation and regular attendees will be invited and 70% of members attend.
- Every spring, beginning 2025, St. James will host a Community Serve Day including outdoor worship and projects within the community. All members and regular attendees (kids included!) will be invited and 80% will participate.
- So that we are equipped to give biblical answers to the questions people have, St. James will promote a Summer Scripture Study Challenge (June-July) in which all members and regular attendees will be invited to participate and 50% will participate.
- Each year, in January, St. James will sponsor a casual one-month "In the Word" Wednesday-night series to learn how to have meaningful Bible Study. All St. James members and attendees as well as Glen Carbon community members will be invited. 50 people from our church and 20 from the community will attend at least one session over the course of the series.
- Beginning 2025, St. James will offer one men's and one women's ministry event each year that facilitates restoration.
- Beginning no later than 2026, St. James will lead an adult short-term mission trip annually.

Next Steps

- May
 - o Sermon Series focusing on Mission Pillars
 - Congregational Feedback
 - Inception of the Campus Planning Team
 - "Facilities facilitate." This simple phrase will guide the campus planning team as they create a plan to match our facilities to our current and future ministries.
 - o Inception of the Financial Planning Team
 - Just as "facilities facilitate," finances facilitate. This team will have a solid understanding of current finances and will work to create a clear financial plan that is built leveraging annual offerings, special accounts, endowments, planned capital campaigns, and the resources of the LCEF.
 - o Prayer
- June
 - o Congregational Vote to Adopt Ministry Plan
 - Adoption and commencement of Ministry Plan
- December
 - Campus Planning Team presents Campus Master Plan to congregation.
 - Financial Planning Team presents a financial picture for the years ahead with suggested campaign and loan schedules if needed to actualize the Campus Master Plan and the adopted Ministry Plan.
