


Old Testament Reading

P⁷How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who brings good news, who proclaim peace, who brings good news, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!" ⁸Listen! Your watchmen lift up their voices; together they shout for joy. When the LORD returns to Zion, they will see it with their own eyes. ⁹Burst into songs of joy together, you ruins of Jerusalem, for the LORD has comforted his people, he has redeemed Jerusalem. ¹⁰The LORD will lay bare his holy arm in the sight of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth will see the salvation of our God. I¹Depart, depart, go out from there! Touch no unclean thing! Come out from it and be pure. you who carry the vessels of the LORD. ¹²But you will not leave in haste or go in flight, for the LORD will go before you, the God of Israel will be your rear guard. P¹³See, my servant will act wisely; he will be raised and lifted up and highly exalted. ¹⁴Just as there were many who were appalled at him – his appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any man and his form marred beyond human likeness -■ ¹⁵so will he sprinkle many nations, and kings will shut their mouths because of him. For what they were not told, they will see, and what they have not heard, they will understand. ¹Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? P²He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground; He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. ³He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces

he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

⁴Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. ⁵But he was pierced for our transgressions. he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. P⁶We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. ⁷He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. **P**⁸By oppression and judgment he was taken away. And who can speak of his descendants? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was stricken. ⁹He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death. though he had done no violence. nor there any deceit in his mouth. P¹⁰Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and cause him to suffer. and though the LORD makes his life a guilt offering, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the LORD will prosper in his hand. ¹¹After the suffering of his soul, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities. ■ ¹²Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong, because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors. Kyrie


Confession of Sins
